MAGNETO

As a boy, he saw his family persecuted, and eventually killed, because of their heritage. As a young man, his wife fled from him in terror. In time, he became the X-Men's greatest foe. With his mutant ability to manipulate the magnetic fields of the Earth, he made many attempts to take over the world and remake it in his image—one in which mutantkind ruled supreme. Now, he is perhaps the most powerful mutant on the planet and the most-hunted.

JUBILE

As a member of the X-Men and Generation X, Jubilation Lee was ever known as the fun-loving mall rat with an attitude. During her adventures with fellow X-Man, Wolverine, Jubilee honed her fighting skills as well as her mutant ability—to generate explosive bursts of energy! A rebel at heart, Jubilee is as comfortable on her own as she is with her teammates.

SYNCH

Everett Thomas possesses a synchronistic aura—an energy field that allows him to become genetically ' with any mutant in close physical proximity to himself. In essence, he has the ability to utilize aspects of other mutants' powers-on a limited basis.

HELMUT ZEMO

Son of a Nazi scientist, Helmut Zemo became the criminal leader known as Baron Zemo. After years of unsuccessfully challenging heroes such as Captain America and the Avengers. Zemo disappeared and returned in the guise of a hero — Citizen V. As Citizen V and leader of the Thunderbolts, Zemo parlayed his power and was able to gain a position within the Sentinel-controlled government. Zemo is responsible for maintaining order over the territories that once comprised the United States of America.

SHINOBI

Son of the long-time enemy of the X-Men Sebastian Shaw, Shinobi has faced off against the mutant group repeatedly himself. Following in his father's footsteps, Shinobi has taken control of the Hellfire Club's Inner Circle and now serves as it's King. Using his power to create a device capable of destroying the Earth by invoking natural disasters, Shaw's ultimate desires remain shrouded in mystery.

WHITE QUEEN

a.k.a. Emma Frost. A telepath of enormous power and questionable morals—a mutant who is more than willing to use her ability to read and control the minds of others. Emma Frost once served as the White Queen of the Hellfire Club's Inner Circle. For a time, she was even the headmistress of Xavier's School for Gifted Youngsters. Now her whereabouts and motivations are unknown.

PSYLOCKE

a.k.a. Betsy Braddock. Psylocke possesses strong telepathic powers and the ability to create psychic "knives" with which to stun and even injure opponents. Once a member of the X-Men, and teammate of Wolverine, Braddock now serves alongside Shinobi Shaw as the Red Queen of the Hellfire Club's Inner Circle.

AMIKO

She became the adopted daughter of Logan nearly twenty years ago. But when she was still a child, she was apparently killed. Now, she has returned, seemingly in the service of the Hellfire Club's Inner Circle. Fighting as an assassin, Amiko is a match, even against her step-father, Logan.
